“Harry Potter and the Half Blood Prince”

Harry Potter makes his first appearance at the Millennium Centre Cinema in Liphook on Friday 8th January 2010 with his latest film, *‘Harry Potter and the Half Blood Prince’*.

Adolescent wizard-in-training Harry Potter returns to Hogwarts for another year of schooling in this, the sixth instalment of the film series that originated from the writings of author J.K. Rowling.

Harry Potter's sixth year at Hogwarts turns out to be quite the exciting year. First off is the arrival of a new teacher at Hogwarts, Horace Slughorn, who is a bit more useful to Harry than he realises. Next, Harry obtains a Potions book which used to belong to the very mysterious Half-Blood Prince. Harry finds that the Half-Blood Prince's ancient scribbles are written along the margins of almost every page, giving Harry advice on how to improve on his Potions work, and also teaching him a few helpful (and dangerous) spells along the way.

"For me, the films have always been about a loss of innocence," says Daniel Radcliffe, the actor behind the title character, who can perhaps no longer be called the boy wizard. "When Harry came into this world, it was all just amazing and brilliant and kind of pure. But as the films have gone on, that's totally disintegrated, and he's realizing that the wizarding world has just as many, if not more, challenges than the world he grew up in before."

Doors open at 7.30pm and the performance starts at 8.00pm. Tickets are priced at £5, with a concession of £4 those under 15 and OAPs. Tickets are available from the Liphook Millennium Centre (01428 723889), Bramshott & Liphook Parish Council Office, and on the door.

The Bar will be open from 7.30pm before the film starts and during the intermission, when a range of refreshments will be on sale.

The film is classified as 12A. Films classified ‘12A’ are not recommended for children below 12. Children under 15, however, must be accompanied by an adult because of licensing regulations.
