#### **“Australia”**

The next showing at the Liphook Millennium Centre Cinema in Liphook will be “Australia” on Friday 19 June 2009.

“Australia” is an epic romance film set in northern Australia at the beginning of World War II. An English aristocrat, Lady Sarah Ashley (Nicole Kidman) inherits a cattle station the size of Belgium. When English cattle barons plot to take her land, she reluctantly joins forces with a rough-hewn drover (Hugh Jackman) and a young Aboriginal boy (Brandon Walters). To meet an army contract, they set out on a journey to drive 2,000 head of cattle across hundreds of miles of the country's most beautiful but unforgiving terrain. In the course of that journey, she falls in love with the drover, and the Australian landscape, and realises that her life is not over, and there's always a new life to be had. Their world is then torn apart by powerful enemies, and they have to find each other amidst the bombing of Darwin, by the Japanese forces that had attacked Pearl Harbour only months earlier.

Doors open at 7.30pm and the performance starts at 8.00pm. Tickets are priced at £5 with a concession of £4 for OAP (60 and over).
